Paolo graduated in Classical Archaeology in Pavia studying the site of Luine in Boario Terme, Valle Camonica, where he now lives. In 2015 he obtained his Ph.D, from University of Pavia, with a research focused on the Protohistory of Valle Camonica. From 2012 he is field co-director of the Pavia archaeological excavations in the settlement of Verucchio – Pian del Monte, as well as supervisor for a research project based in the Capo di Ponte-quattro dossi area in Valle Camonica, one who sees the collaboration between the University of Pavia and the Soprintendenza Archeologia della Lombardia. Along the years Paolo has taken part, beginning as operator and afterwards as supervisor, in many excavations and research projects, becoming collaborator of the Museo Fiorentino di Preistoria "Paolo Graziosi". Working along with many Soprintendenze he took part in several preparations of local and national museums, parks and archaeological areas, while he is now field supervisor for the excavations and research in the sites of Scarceta di Manciano (GR) and Ossimo – PAT (BS). His main fields of research are the study of the population of the preroman Italy, with special focus on the pre-alpine area of Lombardy and the high Adriatic sector. Other points of interest are the methodological aspects of the study of rock engravings, as well as the archaeological applications of the new technologies. On these themes he has been speaker in international and national conferences, has published some articles and co-edited a volume (Digging up Excavations 2016). He is now editing for publication his Ph. D. work of research.
