

Lorenzo earned at the University of Milan his MA in Archaeology in 2005 and in 2009 a Specialization degree in Archaeology. In 2013 he obtained his Ph.D. in Etruscology from the University of Pavia with a research focused on the Archaic and Classic evidences from the network hub of Spina (Ferrara), and since 2012 he is field co-director of the Pavia archaeological excavations in the Iron Age settlement of Verucchio (Rimini). He has worked in 2014 and 2015 as a post-doctoral fellow in the University of Milan Bicocca, Department of Materials Science. Since January 2016 he is post-doctoral fellow at the University of Pavia, Department of Human Studies, where he is research assistant and lecturer in Etruscology and History of Archaeology. Since 2005 he is a professional archaeologist with experiences in surveys and excavations, also as curator of temporary and permanent exhibitions in local and national Museums.

His main research interests concern protohistory and pre-roman archaeology of Italy, especially with regard to methodological, cultural, anthropological, funerary and also manufacturing and archaeometric aspects. On these themes he has been speaker in more than 20 national and international conferences, and he has published a monograph (*Spina città liquida* 2016), a co-edited volume (*Digging Up Excavations* 2016) and more than 30 articles in volumes and journals.
