

Matteo Alessio Chiappedi



Dr. Matteo Alessio Chiappedi was born on September 21st, 1975, in Pavia (Italy). He earned: a PhD in Physiology and Neuroscience at the University of Pavia; a II level Master in “Diagnosis and treatment of learning disorders in the developmental age” at the University of Insubria (Varese, Italy) (2007); a specialization in Psychotherapy (with a psychodynamic orientation) at the “Francesco Bonaccorsi” Foundation of Milan (recognized by the Italian Ministry of Education and University) (2006); a specialization in Child Neuropsychiatry (trained in both child neurology and child psychiatry, as per the Italian university system) at the University of Pavia with full honors (2005); a degree in Medicine (“Medicine and Surgery” according to the Italian university system) at the University of Pavia with full honors (2000).

He is now working for the IRCCS “C. Mondino” (Pavia), where he is principal investigator for a research line financed by the Italian Ministry of Health (Ricerca Corrente 2013; Ricerca Finalizzata 2013) concerning Pervasive Developmental Disorders. He has worked as a child neuropsychiatrist (responsible of a child rehabilitation unit) and researcher for the Don Carlo Gnocchi ONLUS Foundation. He cooperated to some projects financed by the Italian Ministry of Health (Ricerca Corrente 2010) and to a project financed by Lombardy Region (Independent Research 2012). These project concerned rehabilitation of different child neuropsychiatric disorders.

He has authored 49 papers in extenso in journals reviewed by the Index Medicus, 24 papers in scientific journals not reviewed by the Index Medicus, 15 books or book chapters, 32 oral presentations and 36 posters for international scientific meetings.

He’s Adjunct Professor of Child Neuropsychiatry at the University of Pavia (Italy); he was Adjunct Professor of the University of Milan (Italy) and of the Catholic University of Brescia (Italy); he was also Appointed Professor for the School of Specialization in Psychotherapy of the “Francesco Bonaccorsi” Foundation (Milan, Italy).
